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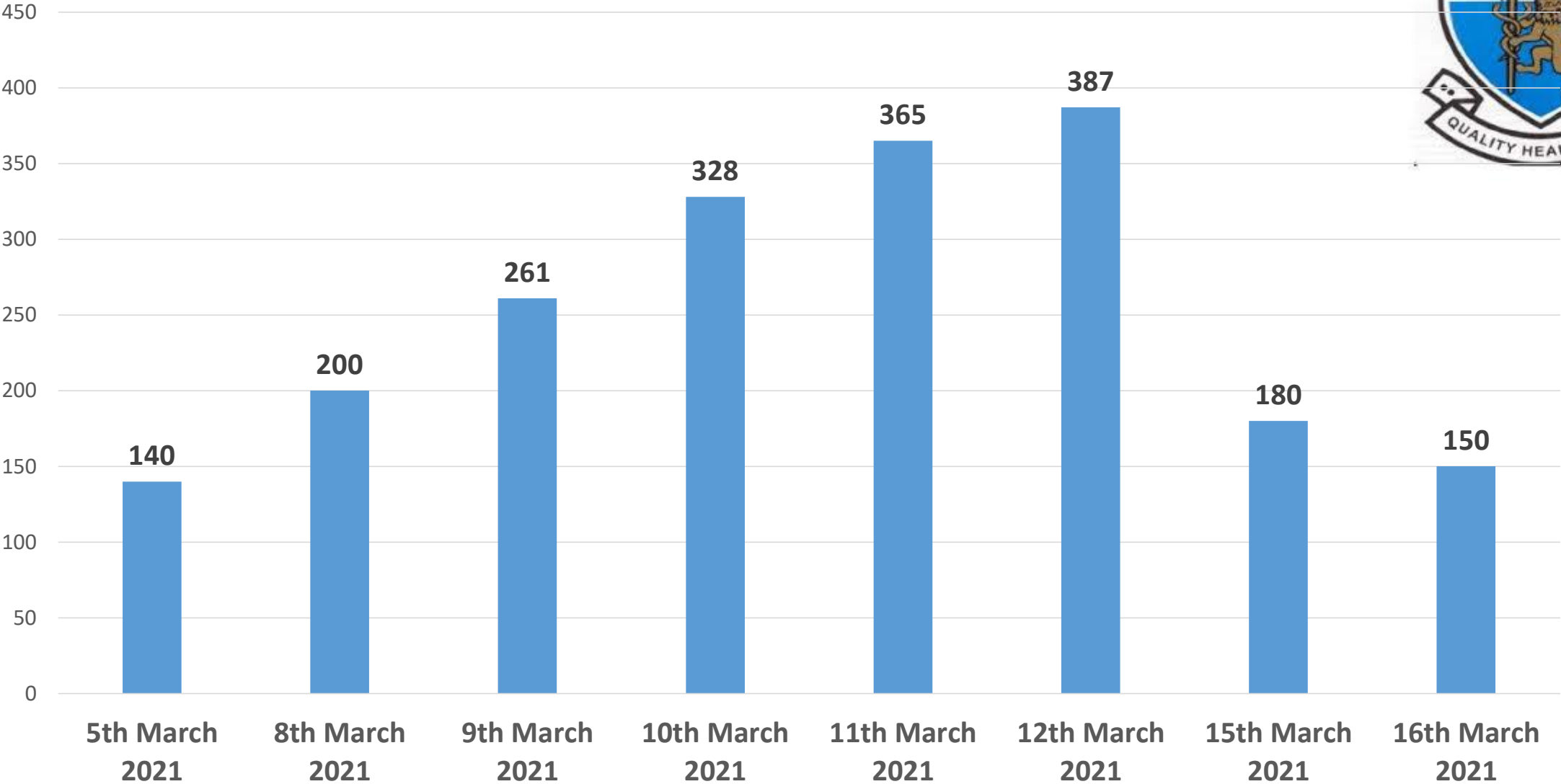

# Pre - vaccination

## Contraindications:

### Pregnant women

- Vaccinator training, on the do's & don't's





# Vaccination day

- Online registration
- Informed consent
- Screening temperature
- Health talk on
  - Importance for vaccination
  - Information on site for vaccination ( left deltoid muscle IM) dosage 0.5mls
  - Available vaccine (Astrazeneca)/ covidshield). Each vial 10 dose.
  - Two doses needed to get fully vaccinated; stat and after 8 wks.
  - Possible mild reactions

## Intra-vaccination

- **Aseptic technique**



- **Reassurance**



## Post Vaccination

- Escort to observation area observe for 15 to 30 min
- Continue reassurance & advise to report back incase of advance reaction or call the center no.
- Sensitize on filling the phamaco-vigilance form incase of any reaction and state the experience with the vaccine (Done at KNH for quality assurance purpose)

# Some reported Common side effects



- No sudden reactions or adverse reactions noted so far.
- Occur 6 - 8hr but resolve within the 2nd day post Vaccination
- The symptoms include mild headache, general malaise, low grade fever and joint pains
- Client advised on enough rest, alot of fluids & fruit.
